Welcome to the Autumn Edition, 2023 of the Sandal Prints. Having journeyed through the forty days and forty nights of the Lenten Season with special emphasis on prayer, penance, and almsgiving now we find ourselves amid Holy Week. Soon we will be at the doorsteps of the Easter (Sacred) Triduum, the celebration of the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

For us here in the Southern Hemisphere, the Lenten journey towards Easter is always a transition from Summer to Autumn. Thus, the daylight hours are shortened, and the hours of the dark night are prolonged. Even the activities and life cycle of some plants and animals are slowing down and heading towards dormition and hibernation. The contrast is experienced in the Northern Hemisphere where day light hours become longer, and dark night hours are shortened. New life and new birth of plants and animals begin to develop and flourish. The natural nature symbolisms of the Northern Hemisphere coincide beautifully with the meaning of Easter. But, what about for us here in the Southern Hemisphere?







The Resurrection of Jesus at Easter is the celebration of New Life, New Hope, New Beginning, and New Creation because Jesus rises from the dead. He is Alive! He restores the dignity of our humanity and won for us eternal salvation. Easter is also the celebration of Christ as the True Light of the world. Where there is darkness, the Light of Christ shines forth more brightly and vividly. We are called not only to follow the Light of Christ, but also to embrace and be bearers of His Light amid the many challenges, difficulties and uncertainties that is around us, and in the world today.

Over the centuries, the Capuchin Missionaries seek to bring the Light of Christ and the Good News of His kingdom to all people throughout the earth. Today the Friars continue this same missionary spirit reaching out to the poorest and remotest areas of the world. The Capuchin's General Secretariat for Missionary Evangelization, Animation and Cooperation together with the International Commission for Economic Solidarity of our General Curia is currently supporting various Capuchin missionary projects throughout the world including countries in Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe, and Latin America.

New Capuchin presence – South Sudan, *Br. Augustyn Chwałek,* member of the fraternity in South Sudan



On February 2 this year, the Capuchin Friars Minor of the Krakow Province opened a new community in South Sudan. This is the first Capuchin presence in the country, and the second Franciscan, as there are already Friars Minor in Juba. Our community is made up of three brothers: Robert Wieczorek, Artur Ziarek and I, Augustyn Chwalek.

We arrived in the world's youngest country (existing since 2011) at the invitation of Bishop Stephen Nyodho of the Diocese of Malakal. It is the largest diocese in South Sudan. There are more than a million Catholics there and only 22 priests. We have been asked to look after the Rubkona parish in Unity state, in the north of South Sudan.

Dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary, Rubkona parish is the oldest in the region. It was founded in 1925 by the Comboni fathers. The church and religious house they built were destroyed in the 1980s during the war in Sudan. Plans were made to rebuild the church for the parish's centennial.

The 2021 overflow, which covered the entire region with water, has hampered that plan for now. Parts of Rubkona and Bentiu (the country's capital) were saved only because the UN people strewn the dykes around the two towns. When we wanted to see the ruins of a 1925 church and house on January 25, we had to use a boat to get there.



Our Lady of the Rosary Parish exists because there are people who belong to it. Some of them live in the surviving part of the town of Rubkona and pray in the makeshift chapel. However, most parishioners live in the camp for internally displaced persons, which is located 5 kilometers north of Rubkona.

It is the largest camp of its kind in South Sudan. Up to 170,000 people can live there in a very small area. They have been staying there since 2013, due to the security problem caused by the civil war, which began 2 years after the separation from Sudan.

To be closer to our parishioners, we have established our community in this camp. It's only two weeks as we are here. Of course, compared to Western standards of living, our settlement is very simple, built with clay, virtually no internet or electricity (we have a small solar panel to charge our cell phones during the day), simple food, what is available here.



However, looking outside our compound, we see people living in worse conditions than us: provisional tents next to the tent, no privacy, food provided by UN organizations, children playing in the drainage ditch along the road.... And the smell... This is the first impression one has when arriving at this place.

We intend to stay here only for a while (a year or two?). There are two important conditions: First, the water will flow into the Nile and the area will be ready for the reconstruction of the 1925 church; second, the security issue will improve. We and the people will feel safe enough to return and rebuild homes and buildings. For now, we are humble students of the culture (we are learning the Nuer language) and the Church that lives here, its traditions and faith.





Orphanages "St. Clare and St. Anthony", Ethiopia: Currently there are forty-six Ethiopian children included in the reception project in orphanages, thirty-six children at the "Santa Chiara" orphanage and ten in the "Sant'Antonio" complex of the Catholic Church of Harar, both under the responsibility of the Apostolic Vicariate. Most of the children come from rural areas where people live in extreme poverty, such as in Chalenko, Caramile, Ejersara, Ejafara, Chiafe, Jilbo, Debito, Legarba and Midagdu. In these villages, adults are not only unable to help the children who have been left without parents, but unfortunately, they are not able to support their own children.

Vincy and is now living in the Student House in Hawthorn, Victoria, where he has commenced full-time studies to complete his studies for the Priesthood. He is also preparing for his Solemn Profession later in the year and is currently involved in the youth ministry. Br. Matthew also cooks for the friars weekly and is the Sacristan for our friary Church, St. Anthony in Hawthorn.









Br. Duy Tran has commenced a Pastoral year in South Melbourne, where he will assist Br. Michael with the Outreach program there. A Pastoral year plans to allow the student to experience the Capuchin life and ministry in a different fraternity and pastoral setting from the student house. The year will give Br. Duy the opportunity and the challenge to develop and deepen the gifts and talents he brings to the Order.





On the other hand, **Br. Isaac Seraphin Webb** has just started the journey of his studies for the priesthood in February. He is also helping the Capuchin outreach in South Melbourne. One day a week, he has ministry at the Australian Catholic University, where he prepares the students to sing at the Mass and assists the chaplains in their ministry to the staff and students. Br. Isaac also shares his talent as a musician by playing the organ for our Sunday evening Mass. Like Br. Matthew, Isaac also takes his turn in cooking for the friars once a week.
