# FEAST OF ST. CLARE IN TIBAR By Fr. Luan Le OFM Cap.



### ST. PADRE PIO MASS AND VENERATION OF RELICS IN AUSTRALIA

During last month, **Fr. Gianmaria Di Giorgio OFM Cap** from Italy visited Australia in commemoration of the 100th anniversary of Padre Pio's permanent stigmata apparition on 20 September 1918, and the 50th anniversary of his death on 23 September 1968. Father Gianmaria brought a **first class relic** that include a pair of Padre Pio's gloves, his hair, a piece of his nail, a scab from the stigmata, and a linen cloth that was used to wipe the blood from his side wound.

From 17th to 19th September in Adelaide and, from 29th September to 1st October in Melbourne, **Fr. Gianmaria** concelebrated Masses and blessed the devotees with the relics, together with our **Capuchin Friars**.

From 20th to 28th September in Perth Fr. Gianmaria concelebrated Masses with local priests at the Cathedral. He joined Arch. Emeritus Barry Hickey on 23rd September, the St. Padre Pio Feast Day Mass.
